The blessings of ministry abound and they keep coming back in surprising ways; this is the way of love given generously.

God cannot be other than who God is and being the children of God we cannot be other than who we are. The blessings are God's gentle reminder, as if someone is saying, "Thank you, and have a good day."

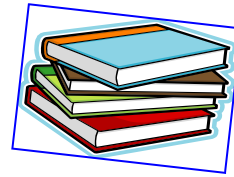

Questions! Questions! Questions! In order to focus, questions can be a helpful aid. Two important questions about Stephen Ministries are as follows: Who are we and what do we do?

We are Stephen Ministry Leaders and Stephen Ministers. Our leaders are Ben Champion, Jim Churchill, Helen Clark, Donna Russell, Skip Tunnell and Marcia Woodruff. After congregations enroll as a registered church (for a fee), they are provided access to extensive training, resources and ongoing support from the national center of Stephen Ministries in St. Louis. Pastors and lay leaders are chosen by each congregation to attend an expensive one-week Leader's Training Course where they are equipped by the faculty from the national center to serve as Stephen Leaders. Then the Stephen Leaders recruit, select and train people in the congregation to serve as Stephen Ministers. The training of Stephen Ministers takes place within the church facilities. Then the Stephen Ministers are assigned to people with needs for care. Stephen Ministers meet with their care receivers for about an hour a week for as long as those persons need this level of care. Stephen Ministers participate in twice-a-month supervision and continuing education provided by the Stephen Leaders.

Having provided this overview of who we are and what we do, we invite members of our congregation to consider becoming Stephen Ministers after having gone through an upcoming series of training sessions to commence in September. We plan to offer an explanatory meeting this spring which will be announced in the church bulletin. This is an opportunity to participate in high-level training and service in Christian caregiving. Incidentally, the founder of Stephen ministries, a clinical psychologist, Kenneth C. Hauk, Ph.D. is the author of a number of books including *Christian Caregiving - a Way of Life*.

Book Review

Psalm 1 describes a tree with green leaves and plentiful fruit. It drinks and flourishes because of a nearby stream. People, too, are able to grow and flourish even when dry winds blow; their secret, seeking nourishment from the messages given from God. The purpose of this book, Seeds of Spiritual Growth, is to provide practical steps for knowing God better. Author Allan Harkness is currently a lecturer on Christian education at Trinity Theological College in Singapore. Each chapter highlights a quote, as in Chapter I: “The true purpose of our existence is quite simply, to look for God, and in looking, to find him, and having found Him, to love Him”...Malcom Muggeridge. Chapter II : “In times of pain and turmoil,” Hemut Thielicke writes, “ when the storm is roaring within us we shall never hear a pin drop; but God, when He comes, comes on the feet of doves, and we must be still.”

There’s an art of remaining in the presence of God daily...Brother Lawrence, a 17th century Monk, provides insights into developing this art. A key factor was his attitude . He saw little division between his work in the noise and clutter of the monastery kitchen and the daily times especially set aside for worship and prayer. One colleague wrote, “He told me that we can accustom ourselves to continual conversation with Him. Our daily routines, like those of Lawrence; walking, driving, performing daily chores, business relationships, will become more like a conversation with God, expressions of thankfulness, confessions of failure, living and becoming in the presence of His light.”

World Mission Initiative's 2010 Mission Conference is coming soon. As usual, it will be at Pittsburgh Theological Seminary, from Friday afternoon to Saturday evening, March 19-20. More than a dozen members of PPC have attended these biennial conferences, from 2002 through 2008. This year's theme is "God says GO", and two keynote speakers and the choice of three workshops (you choose from 17 workshops) will inspire and inform about how you can be effectively involved in all kinds of mission, from local to "frontier."
